Title

Intentions for the project- Why did you choose to study this topic? Why did you choose this artist to investigate? What do you hope to learn? What do you want your artwork to communicate? <u>Artist Investigation-</u> Basic information about the artist. (Do not include useless biographical information). Discuss this artist's process of making artwork. Analyze the artist's style. Choose one artwork from this artist to make a master copy of. This artwork must have a clear connections to your own artwork for the project.

Idea Development

- Create an idea map which combines the assignment's topic with your class theme
- The idea map will include words and images

Original Art work versus your master copy-

- Add a reflection about what you learned by doing the master copy.
- Discuss the pros and cons of using the medium you used for the master copy.
- Make sure you add an image citation under the original

Critique of Master Copy Artwork

Make an original artwork in the style of the artist-

- Show the artwork in 4 stages of development.
- Write a reflection on the conceptual and technical similarities between your artwork and the artist's

- What did you learn by making this artwork?
- What improvements could be made to this artwork?

Reviewing, Reflecting, & Refining

Using analytical and evaluative language you will document your process of creating the final artwork. Do not describe how you made the artwork.

Step 1- Composition Planning

- Include at least 4 thumbnail sketches for possible compositions
- Include a variety of reference photos taken by you.
- Reflect on how you will compose the final image based on the reference photos and thumbnail sketches.

Step 2- Choosing Size and Medium

- What medium are you using and why?
- What are the pros and cons of this medium?
- Is this medium the best for expressing my concept?

Step 3- Reflection on Signs, Symbols, and Imagery

- Annotate a sketch explaining the meaning of everything in your artwork.
- Will people be able to understand the meaning of your artwork? Ask for advise from a 3rd party.
- Is the imagery in your artwork too obvious or clique?

<u>Steps 4-6</u>

- Show photos of your process.
- When you are close to finishing give yourself a critique using the 4 steps (Describe, Analyze, Interpret, and Judge).

Step 7- Reflection & Refinements After Class Critique

- Did the class understand your concept?
- What improvements could be made to your artwork?
- What did you learn from the critique?

Conclusions & Connections

Use analytical and evaluative language to explain the meaning of your artwork, make connections to your artist investigation, and express how your portfolio has developed further.

Artist Statement

- Write a short artist statement about your final artwork.
- What personal meanings are communicated?
- How will this artwork contribute to the creation of a coherent body of artwork?
- How has your theme evolved?

Did I reach a level of mastery?

- Did your critique go well?
- Did you use a highly appropriate medium for your final artwork?
- Did you fulfill your stated intentions from the first page of the pp?
- Did you apply all feedback to reach a level of mastery with your final artwork? If you did not you should do another artwork and add it here.

• Create a list of technical and conceptual skills you acquired through the process of this project.
